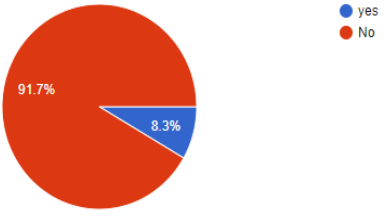
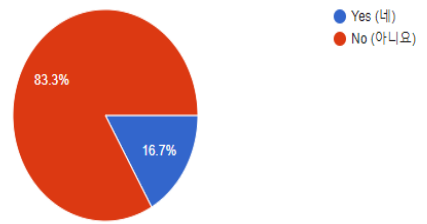


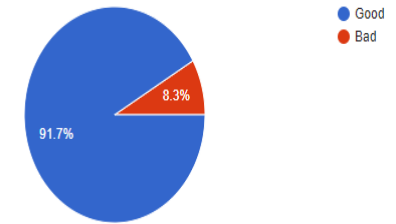
Are you satisfied with your current bell schedule?

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Block Schedule

Problem

A lot of students are taking only **three to four classes a day** in **the United States** because numerous Americans believe that **taking a fewer number of classes for a longer period of time is much more effective way for education**. They call this method of scheduling **block scheduling**. However, in Fayston Preparatory high school, students are still taking **five to seven classes a day** which greatly reduces study efficiency. To be more specific, students usually fail to manage their time because there are too many lessons to digest and too many assignments to do in a day.

Policy

Claims

First of all, taking five to seven classes a day prevent students from studying in depth and teachers from fully showing their abilities. In every class, teacher should get enough time to teach because enough time will allow them to use various ways to teach such as group activities, peer collaboration, or going over many kinds of problems. Then, majority of students will eventually learn and understand the contents more thoroughly and easily.

Second, Fayston's current bell schedule is the problem because it makes students difficult to study efficiently at home. If students take five to seven classes a day, they need to review more than five different lessons after coming back to home.

Third, Fayston's current bell schedule should be considered as a problem because it only benefits top students. If one class lasts 50 minutes, students should quickly focus and always listen carefully to the lesson because most of the classes do not go leisurely. Furthermore, teachers cannot properly individualize instruction and take care of each students. Therefore, the mediocre students cannot easily follow the course because current bell schedule requires students to have extremely high ability to concentrate in class and organize their time.
